EDC BOARD SELECTS EAST TOWN AS NEW NAME FOR BUSINESS DISTRICT



On May 5, 2016 after almost two years and countless community engagement meetings with the many stakeholders interested in the East side of Downtown Minneapolis, the East Downtown Council Board of Directors officially adopted "East Town" as the new name for our business district. *East Town* has the new Commons Park as its heart, along with the Wells Fargo mixed use development, US Bank Stadium, the refreshed Armory and several new and revitalized businesses, amenities and public assets.

In the past, depending upon who you talk to, the area has been called East Downtown, Downtown East, Mill District, Elliot Park and the Metrodome area. The district branding effort, led by the business community with guidance and input from the neighborhood organizations, seeks to bring the area together much as a South Minneapolis business community did in the 1930's when "Uptown" united several neighborhoods together around the newly built Uptown Theater.

The graphic presentation developed by PadillaCRT, mostly through pro bono efforts, provides a significant preliminary visual brand statement. The main brand image and accompanying graphic represents the convergence of multiple *East Town* public amenities including the green presence of the park, the coming together of the Blue and Green LRT lines, and the letter "E" in thin script with a line that winds around in a circular motion connecting the many streetscapes and iconic features of *East Town* together.

PadillaCRT's accompanying renderings offer some preliminary representations of key features found in *East Town* including the Stadium, the Armory, and the Commons Park. These visualizations and potential installations are very preliminary with the goal of working with community partners in the coming months to design an array of creative expressions that continue to help everyone feel more connected and part of an emerging and shared vision.

The brand vision driving the visual identity paints a compelling vision of where we are going with our new name:

East Town

A Vibrant, Multifaceted and Connected Community

Whatever your lifestyle or interest, *East Town* is the place to connect. The community is a regional focal point that offers a diverse range of activities near the center of Downtown. You'll walk streets that are rippling with life and too many activities to choose from, all surrounding a new metropolitan park, where you can rest, play or catch a performance and a stadium where you can watch the big game.

HCMC Clinic and Pharmacy to Open in North Loop Neighborhood



Hennepin County Medical Center (HCMC) will open a new clinic and pharmacy to serve people living and working in the North Loop area and central business district in downtown Minneapolis.

"North Loop is the fastest growing residential neighborhood in Minneapolis and the people who live there have been asking

for a local clinic and pharmacy to serve their health care needs," said Jon L. Pryor, MD, MBA, CEO. "This new clinic will do that, and serve a broader need for several sought-after specialties for people who live and work in the area."

The new clinic and full service pharmacy will open later this year on the first floor of the Tractor Works building at 800 Washington Avenue North.

"This is an active neighborhood and this clinic will provide convenient access to

primary care, chiropractic care and acupuncture services that neighborhood residents told us they want," said Scott Wordelman, FACHE, Sr. Vice President of Ambulatory Care & Support Services. "We will also offer allergy and dermatology specialty care by board-certified physicians, as well as additional specialties, such as women's health and sports medicine."

The clinic will blend high tech and high touch, with top medical care and conveniences like online scheduling, personal electronic medical records and wellness, nutrition, and fitness programming for the neighborhood.

"Our mission is to improve the health and wellness of the whole community and this clinic, along with the rest of our growing clinic system, supports that mission," said Pryor.

HCMC recently announced the move and expansion of the Richfield Clinic, scheduled to open in a larger, more visible location in Richfield this fall. In downtown Minneapolis, HCMC operates an employer clinic and multiple primary care and specialty clinics on the main medical center campus. Construction also is underway on a new 377,000 square foot ambulatory clinic and surgery center that will open in early 2018.

"Between the new North Loop Clinic and our main campus we are able to meet every health care need of downtown residents, workers, and visitors," said Wordelman. "People can stay in one system to get the full continuum of care, and it's all located close to where they live or work."

'Iron Clad' Hotel, Apartment Project Proposed for Downtown East



Minneapolis-based Graves
Hospitality has submitted new
plans for its hotel and apartment
project, now dubbed "Iron Clad,"
in Downtown East near U.S.
Bank Stadium. The preliminary
plans, submitted to the Planning
Commission Committee of the

Whole, show a 153-room Marriott Moxy hotel and 166 market-rate apartments. The mixed-use project, consisting of an eight-story hotel, a 15-story apartment and a

four-story office building, would also have roughly 30,000 square feet of office space and 15,000 square feet of retail space. The project also features a rooftop sign on the apartment building for the Moxy hotel, which is part of Marriott's growing line of hip hotels.
