

Minneapolis retail pop-up pilot aimed for Final Four weekend


Chameleon Consortium wants to try out a retail concept in vacant downtown office space

A proposal to repurpose empty space in office buildings in downtown Minneapolis into pop-up retail stores could get its first test drive during April's Final Four.







UNITS ON-LINE METRO AREA

- Rents have risen, on average by slightly more than 4% annually since 2008 in Downtown Minneapolis
- ► Rents have risen, on average by 3.5% annually since 2008 in the Metro Area
- Development is accelerating in the suburban locations, but slowing modestly in the Downtown
- Seeing somewhat higher vacancies in the newest properties as some renters are hopping to take advantage of move-in specials
- Robust job growth has continued to fuel apartment development
- ► Rising interest rates may reduce new starts
