# VII. Ongoing Discussion of 2022-23 Strategic Planning Goals

- **A. Community Engagement.** As a follow on to last month's meeting, Shannon distributed the community resources package (not included in the Board package) to demonstrate the types of information to avail to customers. Noting that other resources could be included, she led a discussion to obtain further feedback.
- **B.** Committees. Shannon reviewed those who have been assigned:

  - 4. Business Sector. Kirsten, Cyndy, Jaquie, Jacob, and Aimee will meet on the second Thursday of the month at 9 a.m.
  - **5. Marketing and Communications.** Wendy, Cassie, Tom, and Jenifer will meet on the fourth Thursday of the month at 9 a.m.

She will follow up with those who have not yet been assigned.

**C. Membership Recruitment.** Shannon reviewed the MDC data source it uses to determine who is downtown block by block for recruitment purposes which is taking a while to update. If any of us would like to see it more closely, let her know because the system is proprietary. Discussion then ensued on how to use it to recruit more people to restaurant / hospitality sector events and drive more traffic to East Town.

Shannon would love for us to spend time on getting to know the open restaurants this year and getting together with the

guys who are doing this.

## IX. Old / New / Other Business

The Falls Initiative by Blake Slette, Outreach and Communications Assistant (<a href="https://thefalls.org/about/#team">https://thefalls.org/about/#team</a>; <a href="https://www.signalhire.com/profiles/blake-slette%27s-email/135871232">https://www.signalhire.com/profiles/blake-slette%27s-email/135871232</a>). He began by acknowledging the leadership of the four Mni Sota Dakota Tribal Nations (which he is not a part of) who engaged with them throughout this process and the government partners, e.g., the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, the City, the Park Board, and the Minnesota Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund.

Minneapolis is built around St. Anthony Falls (<a href="https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Saint\_Anthony\_Falls">https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Saint\_Anthony\_Falls</a>), a very significant place for indigenous people, and the specific site they're working on is the Upper Lock and the adjacent land, excluding Mill Ruins Park, that's going through a conveyance process. Several milestones have occurred since this process began, the most recent being the Memorandum of Understanding reached between the FOF, City, and Park Board; and the launch of public engagement including the five Community Conversations series with graphic recordings (<a href="https://thefalls.org/engage/#phase6">https://thefalls.org/engage/#phase6</a>) and some pop-up engagement this summer. Where they stand today is moving away from the public engagement and design process and towards fundraising.

Slette then shared what they heard from the public engagement process, all of which can be found at <a href="https://thefalls.org/native-partnership-council/#heard">https://thefalls.org/native-partnership-council/#heard</a>. There are five big themes that have been brought forward and carried into their current programming and partnership studies: water is life; water and culture; knowledge sharing; ceremony; and indigenous food system. There are many things they've heard, one is that USACE is not considering removal of the Upper Lock but to reuse it as an opportunity to heal the story disrupted, support for less structures and more restoration, spiritual and contemplative spaces.

He also explained that they're going through a design process with GGN in Seattle (<a href="https://www.ggnltd.com/">https://www.ggnltd.com/</a>) and BJK (?) here in Minneapolis; the vision is to gain access to the water.

Lastly, he explained their next steps: continue to focus on programming and partnerships; continue the conveyance process with USACE; explore ownership and operations models; fundraise; schematic design for early enhancement of the site.

Christie advised the DMNA is working in partnership with the Falls Initiative, the Guthrie Theatre, and the Native Advisory Council at the Guthrie (<a href="https://www.guthrietheater.org/about-us/native-advisory-council/">https://www.guthrietheater.org/about-us/native-advisory-council/</a>), to do a land acknowledgement project. It's a grassroots effort started by volunteers who have met a few times, and the first part of the project is to put up signage along the river in the Mill District to let visitors know they're on native land.
